Allowing your pet to run loose or not registering your pet is an offence enforceable by the Ontario Provincial Police and the By-law Enforcement Officer.

Each occurrence is also subject to a fine. We remind you to purchase your 2019 dog/cat tag. This is the only way to ensure the safe return of your pet should it manage to get away.

Otherwise, your pet will be taken to the nearest SPCA and costs incurred will be the owners responsibility.

Dog and/or cat license.


\$30.00 for each pet.

Ice Safety and Tips.

Don't let this be you. Check ice thickness before you go. There are always potential hazards of being on frozen lakes, ponds, rivers and streams in winter. Here are a few tips and suggestions to remember when considering venturing out on a frozen lake or pond:

- *No ice is safe ice.
- *At least 4 inches of ice is recommended for safe ice fishing; 5 inches for snowmobiling.
- *If you don't know, don't go.
- *Wear life jackets or flotation suit
- *Always tell someone where you will be and when you plan to be back.
- *Clear blue ice is the strongest
- *White opaque or snow ice is half as strong as blue ice.
- *Opaque ice is formed by wet snow freezing on the ice.
- *Gray ice is unsafe. The grayness indicates the presence of water.

Some bodies of water can appear to be frozen solid but will actually have thin ice in several unsuspecting areas.
